## JEAN SHEPHERD SET THREE - MORE SYNDICATED HALF-HOUR SHOWS FROM 1976 - 1977 - Dolby B.

3 shows on each 90 minute tape - 39 shows. Special price for this set (#26 - 34, 9 tapes) \$45 pp.

The following 9 cassettes are made up of half-hour shows, from late in the syndicated run (probably late Spring 1977). These FM airchecks from WBUR Boston are in generally excellent sound, except for the following minor defects: many of the shows had a slight high-pitched whistle, and a few of the shows slowed down as they went along. I have eliminated most of the whistle and adjusted the speed as well as possible, although a few got so slow that the last minute or two still sound a bit slower than they should. These are marked \*. Two shows, marked @, had bad tracking for the first several minutes. These are minor problems, and overall these are among the best sounding shows around.

### EARLY SYNDICATED SHOWS FROM BOSTON - TWO SETS - The cost of either set is \$55, or all 24 MH tapes for only \$100.

The following were recorded from FM in Boston. Like the later syndicated shows, these are complete recordings of the WOR program with the commercials removed. Dates are approximate. They run from about 35 to 40 minutes each, with 2 shows per 90 minute cassette. The hour-long shows were originally from Saturday broadcasts. Sound quality is generally good with occasional station drift or bad tuning. For my own sanity, I have reconfigured these sets into (nearly) consecutive order. I have broken up the tapes into two groups of twelve,

each set containing ten 90 minute tapes, and two full-hour shows. If you already have either of the original sets you can get the tapes you are missing at the old rates. Write for details.

One final note on these: my MH series does not follow the original Matinee House numeration completely, so there are occasional gaps in the numbering and dates out of sequence.

Fascinating show excerpts mostly from a Saturday afternoon (12:15 to 2 PM) 2-hour series Due to the recording format (1800' reels that hold somewhat more than 90 minutes per track), very few of these tapes contain complete programs, but only as much as would fit on the tape. I have transferred the tapes directly as I got them, complete with all the news of the day, read by great radio announcer Dwight Weist, in order to preserve the historic context. All tape

starts, stops, and edits are as laid down by the original home taper, Howie Mann, who graciously gave me the reels. Some of the shows are listed out of sequence. This is due to my desire to fully preserve these recordings intact. Where possible I have made each tape self-contained, but the last few tapes run together, so take note of the tape contents in order to get complete shows. Or just get the whole set!

## JEAN SHEPHERD VIDEO TAPES

The picture quality on all of these tapes is quite good, but not on the level of a store-bought video. These programs are home recordings made at the time of the original broadcasts (except for **Shepherd's Pie**), before the advent of home Hi-Fi VCRs. The shows on Tape One contain part of the teasers for the shows: "Phantom" is missing a few seconds of music at the very beginning, but all dialog is there. These programs are not commercially available, and probably never will be, due to music clearance problems. All tapes are recorded on Maxell T-120 tapes in Hi-Fi mode at high speed (SP), except PBS #2 which needs a T-160.. The three theatrical releases: "A Christmas Story" (MGM-UA), "It Runs in My Family" aka "A Summer Story" (MGM-UA - 1994 Family Treasures series), and "Ollie Hopnoodle's Haven of Bliss" (Disney Home Video) can be found in many large video stores and mail-order houses.

Most are FM Airchecks, until 9/17/66, when the broadcasts were on AM only. These shows, and the releases to follow from 1963 to 1966 are from an amazing cache of WOR airchecks I found right here in Queens! Sound quality is generally excellent, with occasional problems caused by the age of the master tapes. Some tape edge curling has caused a bit of fading in and out in spots, which I have tried to note. There are very rare occurrences of very small segments missing due to broken splices. As with all airchecks, portions of the opening or closing themes may be missing, but cause no loss of the program portion, except as noted. Finally, due to single motor technology of old tape recorders, programs may occasionally drift off-speed, although I have done my best to correct that. Overall these problems are very minor, but I felt the need to point out the variety of defects that are possible on a few of these tapes. As usual, I guarantee your satisfaction!

I have had special 100 minute tapes custom-loaded, so there isn't nearly as much overlapping of shows as in the first set, except where the shows are so closely linked as to make it acceptable. One note: Shep seemed to have some recurring set pieces in his repertoire in this era: **Og and Charlie** made frequent appearances demonstrating the timeless nature of human traits. "**Listen Baby**" is my designation for the lengthy monologues over mellow jazz of Shepherd talking to an unheard girlfriend.

**1966 Set 5 - End of the FM Era (12 90-minute cassettes, 18 hours, \$60 Postpaid)**

On August 01, 1966, a new FCC regulation went into effect, forbidding radio stations from simulcasting the same programming on FM and AM outlets. Shep was bumped from the FM side of WOR. It took Rudy (the guy who taped all these shows) a while to find the best place to put his radio for decent reception, as you will hear from these early examples of the AM-only programs. You will also detect various AM artifacts on most of the remaining Rudy shows - whistle, static, FM bleed of opera shows in the background, etc. These defects will diminish in the later recordings, to be released in the not so distant future.

## **NEWLY DISCOVERED FRED ALLEN SHOWS - RARE!**

Most of the following Fred Allen shows were recently unearthed. The commercials and musical numbers on tapes 2-13 were removed at the time the shows were recorded to save disc space and costs. The remaining program parts run from about 44" to 50" out of the full hour broadcasts. I don't believe that full versions of any of these shows are known to exist. The last 4 tapes listed are also rare; 4 new Texaco half-hours with Arthur Godfrey, and two examples of the ground-breaking comedy team of Stoopnagle and Budd.

## The Little House Halfway Up In The Next Block - VIC AND SADE by Paul Rhymer

Vic and Sade, product of Paul Rhymer's heart and wit, was called "an oasis of smiles amidst a sea of tears". Unlike the soap operas surrounding it, each episode of this daily series was a complete vignette with a beginning, middle, and end. There were only four characters who appeared regularly on the show - Victor R. Gook: the patriarch, bookkeeper for the Consolidated Kitchen-ware Company, Skybrother in the Sacred Stars of the Milky Way Lodge, and parade enthusiast. He was played by Art Van Harvey. Bernadine Flynn was Sade: wife, homemaker, mother of adopted son Rush and later Russell. Rush was played by Bill Idelson. He grew up on the show, and in the surviving examples he is a high school student who is inventive, imaginative, and industrious. When Idelson went off to WWII, he was replaced by David Whitehouse as Russell. He is younger than Rush, and a little more brash, and both of the youngsters are often ignored by their elders on the show. The last of the regulars was Fletcher Rush, Sade's Uncle, played by Clarence Hartzell. He was brought into the show as a possible replacement

for Art Van Harvey when he got ill, and stayed on until the end of the series. Uncle Fletcher was the ultimate scatterbrained, non sequitur-spewing, but loveable old geezer. After Vic & Sade left the airwaves, Hartzell continued to play similar characters on One Man's Family and Lum and Abner.

Through this family and the discussions of their daily activities, a host of friends and neighbors became just as well known as the main characters, although they never appeared. (For the few exceptions to this, see tape #6, where two new speaking parts were added briefly).

Paul Rhymer's writing was both musical and poetic. It presented to listeners a surreal version of small-town America, with all its eccentricities and odd characters. The seasoned ensemble of actors brought this world to perfect life.

Many of the programs offered here were originally prepared for broadcast on the daily Serial on WBAI. They may have opening and closing themes and commercials added if they were not on

the existing copies of the shows, in order to recreate the sound of the original broadcasts. This was necessary because many of the episodes in circulation contain only the story portion. There are two likely explanations for this. The actors broadcast from Chicago, but the commercials for Proctor and Gamble were done in New York. It is possible that only the Chicago portions were transcribed. Another explanation I've heard is that there were times when the show was broadcast on both NBC and Mutual, and the Mutual versions contain only the opening announcer and the story, but no commercials. Take your pick.

Complete network copies are used when they exist. All shows have been equalized and speed-corrected as needed, and the best copy selected when I had multiple sources.
